What is Tabw?

Tabw provides emotional support and advocacy for victim-survivors of police perpetrated Violence Against Women, Domestic Abuse and Sexual Violence who live or work in the South Wales or Gwent Police force areas. Tabw will also offer this support to police colleagues in these police force areas. The service is open to all genders.

Tabw will provide emotional and practical support to encourage victim-survivors to reach out, responding to their own identified needs and recognizing their unique challenges and situations. The service is not time limited and will work collaboratively with local Service Providers to ensure quality and reach of support on offer.

Referral Criteria

Tabw offers services to people:

- ► Of any gender
- ► Who are or have experienced abuse perpetrated by an employee of South Wales or Gwent Police Force
- ▶ Who are employed by South Wales or Gwent Police Force
- ► Whether they have reported to police or not
- ► Have concerns about someone else who fits the above criteria
